Our Current Focus

- Working w Transport Canada to regulate ownership and remove derelicts
- Rationalize mooring buoy regulations
- Preserve access to coastal anchorages
- Modify planned dock regulations and relieve moorage crisis



Current Moorage Crisis

Mosquito CreekMarina

- Ladysmith Maritime Society
- Pender Harbour & Sunshine Coast
- Howe Sound, Gulf Islands and Central Coast



Mosquito Creek Marina

- Closure of 400 slips by Squamish F/N as of May 2024
- After protests, float homes to stay
- BUT no plans or assurance for future moorage



Ladysmith Maritime Society

- 170 slips, museum, coffeeshop, workshop and dragon boat club.
- 2029 Lease arbitrarily ended Dec 31, 2023 <u>without</u> <u>consultation</u>
- BC gave the Stz'uminus First Nation control Jan 1, 2024
- LMS request to stay and pay refused
- LMS requests help for legal fees to recover \$6M for docks




Pender Harbour Dock Management Plan

- Planning since 2018 between shishalh and BC without any stakeholder input
- Expanded to include entire 'swiya' + inland lakes
- Over 700 docks and properties affected with strict new regulations
- Potential precedent for moorage regulations for all BC waters



DMP Update

- Lobbying has been effective:
- 1. Now grandfathering, self registration and 10 year window to upgrade
- 2. Separate planning for lakes vs tidewater
- 3. CBCYC now accepted as advisory body
- 4. BUT, impractical design constraints remain
- 5. <u>Still founded on thin environmental</u> <u>science</u>



Southern Gulf Islands Waterfront Management Plan

- Moritorium on 180 private waterlot applications extended to August 2025
- 5 First Nations consensus required
- CBCYC engaged for comment



National Marine Conservation Area Reserve

- Federal initiative to support FN economic development
- BC/First Nations want restrictions to anchorage access
- CBCYC challenging BC's authority to close anchorages in Boat Havens



PHARA Legal Challenge

- Exclusion leads to confrontation and expensive legal challenges!
- Petition to BC Supreme Court on constitutional authority for BC to negate rights and freedoms in Canadian constitution:
- 1. Give veto on land use decisions to unelected parties, i.e. First Nations
- 2. Overreach into federal jurisdiction and existing treaty agreements
- 3. Lack of consultation by those affected by decisions
- CBCYC has supported legal effort to clarify the decision making authority over land use decisions



Lessons for Us All

- Don't expect any decisions on the subject until after BC election
- Contact your MLA and MP to propose more inclusive approach to T&R
- We must not be part of the problem!
